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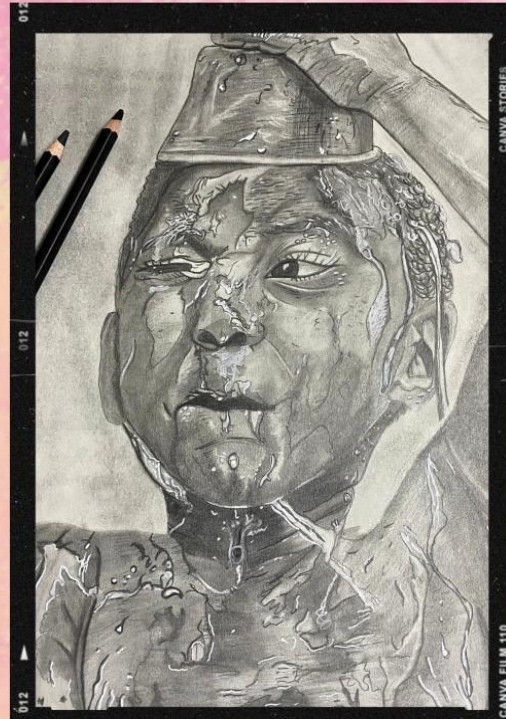
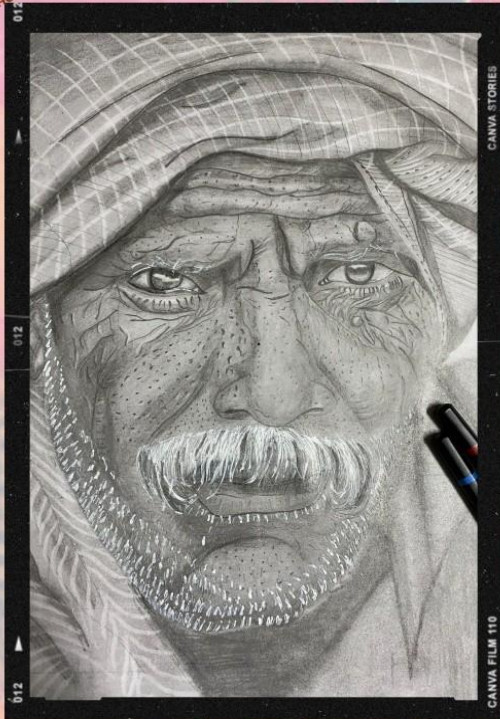

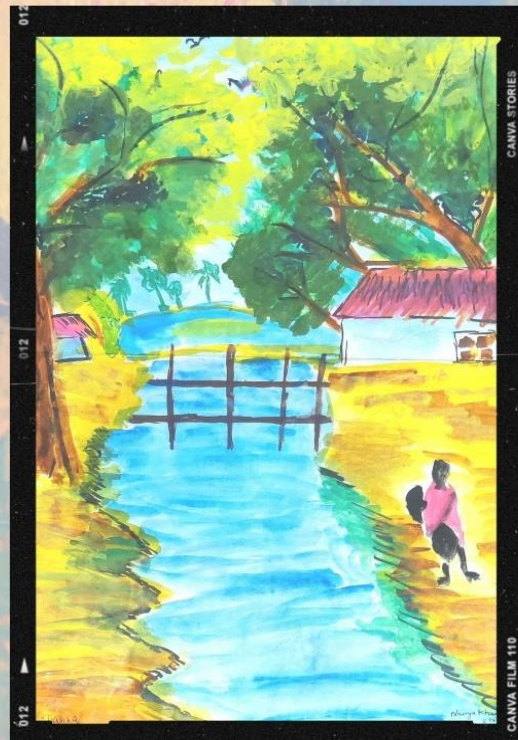

POSTCARD ACTIVITY



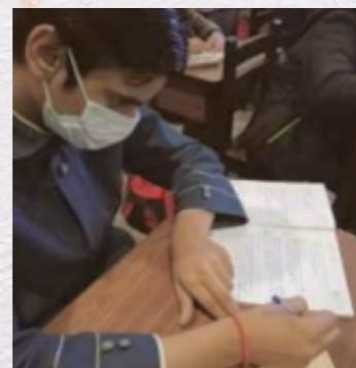

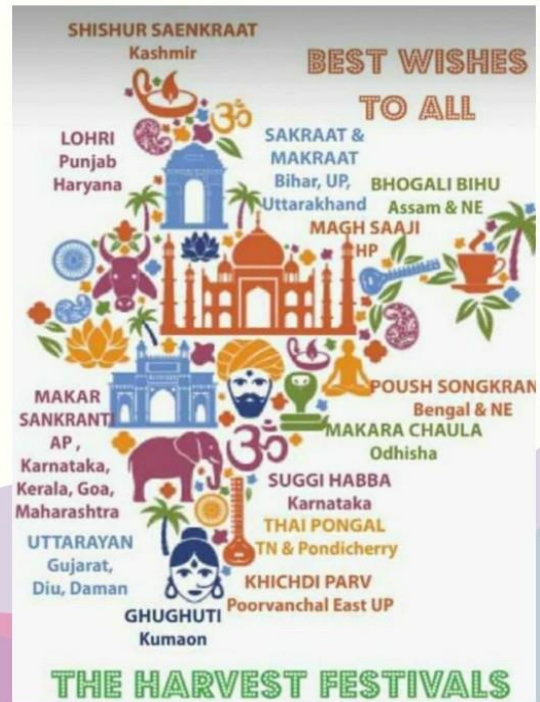




EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

Innovative tools are added to provide relevant knowledge, they are now developing their skills by adopting different methods of learning strategies.

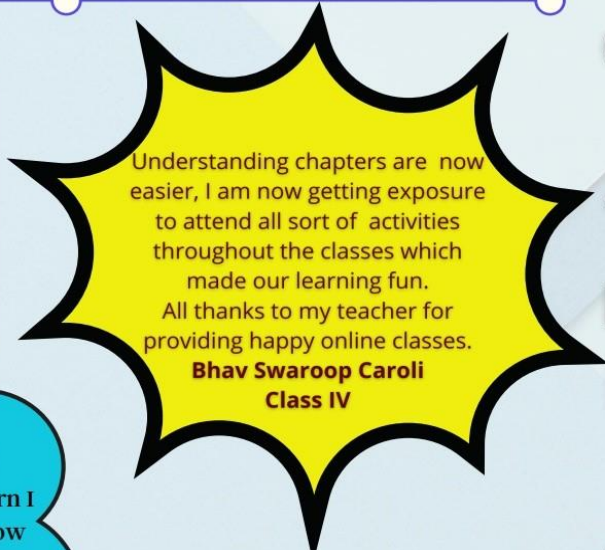
We are in an era where smart boards have replaced chalkboards and tablets have replaced textbooks.

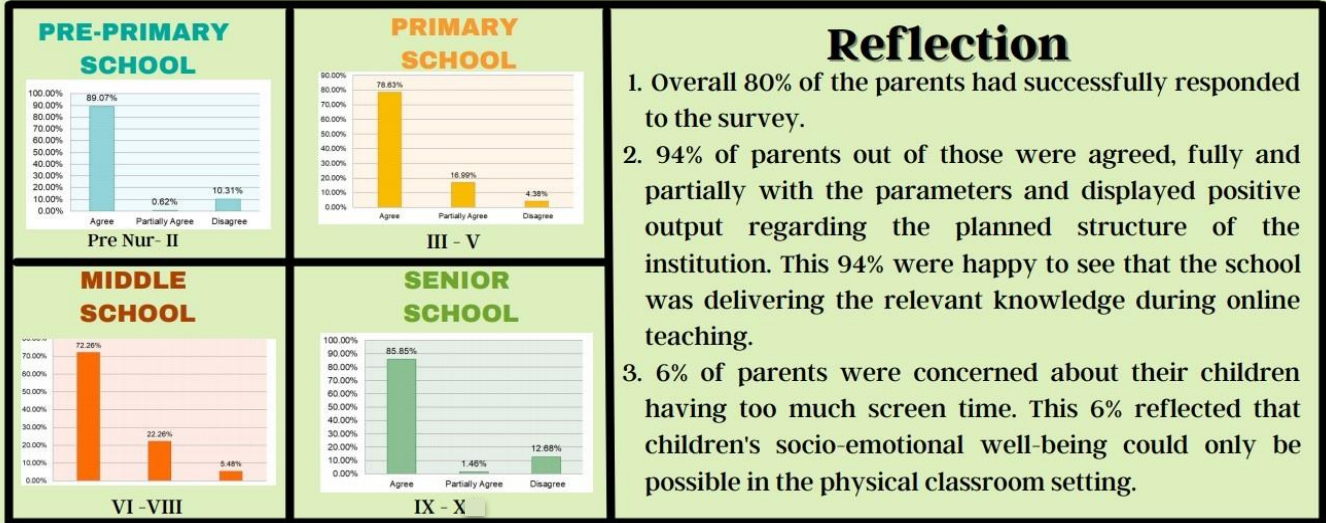


PARENT SURVEY REFLECTION

Saturday, 29 January 2022, A survey was conducted by the school to get feedback from parents on effective reflection of the teaching-learning process during online classes.

The questionnaire comprised of the following:

1. School is functioning effectively in order to fulfil the child's holistic development.
2. School gives equal importance to extracurricular activities as much as academic activities.
3. Teachers use innovative methods to make it easier for students to understand complex topics.
4. Effective communication is facilitated between teachers and students during online classes.
5. Teachers are using effective assessment tools to evaluate students day to day performance.



Reflection

1. Overall 80% of the parents had successfully responded to the survey.
2. 94% of parents out of those were agreed, fully and partially with the parameters and displayed positive output regarding the planned structure of the institution. This 94% were happy to see that the school was delivering the relevant knowledge during online teaching.
3. 6% of parents were concerned about their children having too much screen time. This 6% reflected that children's socio-emotional well-being could only be possible in the physical classroom setting.
